## Yom Hashoah Memorial Display Book— A Book of Remembrance for Martyrs of the Holocaust

This project is wonderful for several reasons: first because it is a Sisterhood project which involves the entire congregation, and also because it utilizes a craft or art which we have not highlighted very much — calligraphy. This scribal art is as ancient as the Torah and therefore is a very Judaic craft.

This project can be announced on *Yom Kippur* after discussion with your Rabbi. Below is a quotation which may be used. Other appropriate quotations may be selected. A questionnaire should be sent out to the entire congregation asking for the necessary information about family lost in the Holocaust: names, ages, towns or cities, concentration camps (see below).

The calligraphy may be in color or black on fine parchment or paper. Once an appropriate binder and parchment paper are selected and the project is completed (with room for additional names), a stand should be purchased for the lobby or *bimah* to permanently display this reminder.
