Parliamentarian Jackie Isaacson—The Security Officer on a cruise ship has the job of keeping all guests and crew safe, and protecting the property of the passengers and the ship. Likewise, as Parliamentarian, you will help assure that the rules of the Sisterhood are followed and meetings run smoothly.

Publicity Chair Nancy Fichman—The Sales and Marketing Manager on a cruise ship would optimize existing sales channels and establish new ones to enhance performance from cruise booking onward. As Publicity Chair, you will be marketing Emanuel's Sisterhood!

Financial Secretary/Treasurer Faith Helene and Assistant Treasurer Karin Cohen—The Purser manages the money on a cruise ship. They are in charge of all financial matters and

oversee other financial personnel. As Financial Secretary and Treasurer, your job is to manage the finances of your Sisterhood.

VP Fundraising Lynne Altschuler—The Casino Dealer on a cruise ship oversees games in a ship's casino. Of course, while everyone hopes to enjoy themselves and come back richer than they started out, the main winner is always the cruise ship! As Vice President of Fundraising, your job is to make sure the Sisterhood has the financial independence to conduct its work.

VP Programming Carolyn Topol and Jennifer Molinari—The Activities Coordinator plans and oversees recreational and other activities aboard a cruise ship. As Programming Co-Vice Presidents, you will plan and oversee many activities for The Emanuel Synagogue Sisterhood.

VP Membership Elaine Cohen—Many cruise lines have a loyalty program and the job of the loyalty ambassador is to keep the cruisers happy and continuing to book further cruises. Likewise, the Membership Vice President's job is that of retention and renewal.

VP Torah Fund Cheryl Rosenbaum—A Lecturer on a cruise ship provides opportunities to learn about the itinerary and ports visited. Likewise, as Torah Fund Vice President, you will have the opportunity to educate your members about the importance of supporting Torah Fund.
