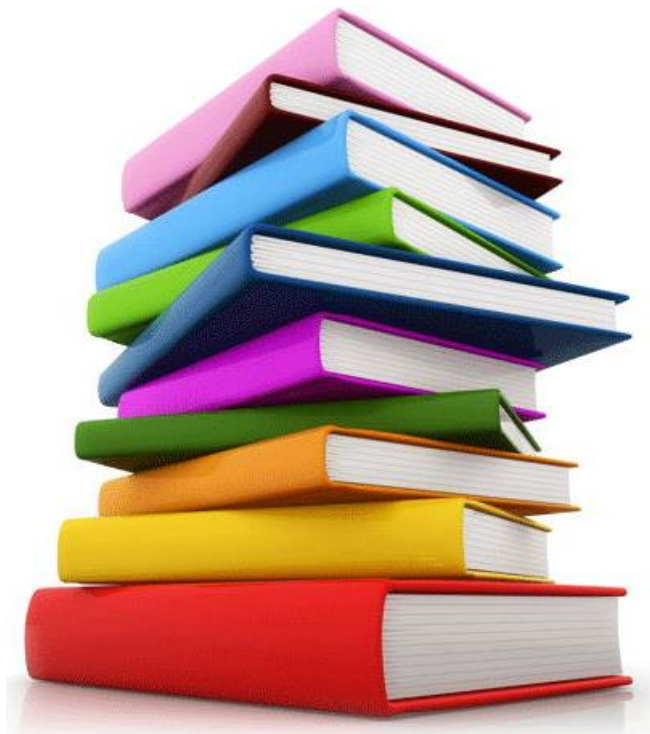

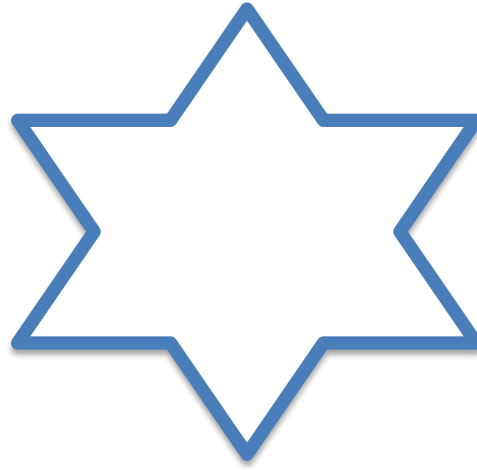
This group is devoted to discussions about Women's League Sisterhoods Judaica Shops including:

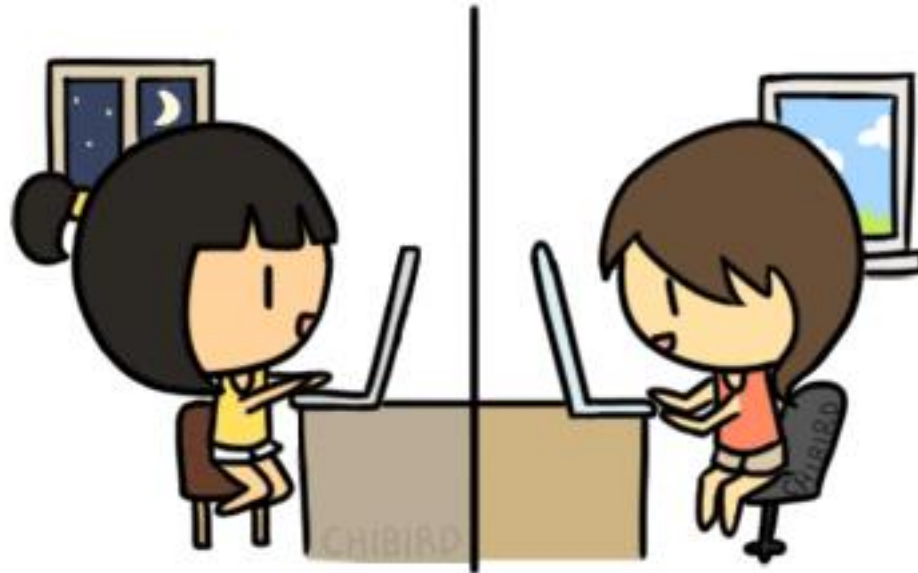
