

Pesach Place Cards

Seder place cards can serve several purposes:

1. To beautify the *seder* table
2. To expedite seating
3. For use as a bookmark during the service
4. As a memento

They can be made for one-time use or kept from year to year by spraying them with Krylon Crystal Clear to make them more permanent.

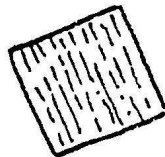
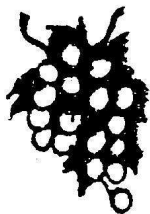
You can purchase blank place cards or cut your own out of cardboard, which you fold in half. The half should be approximately 1½" x 3½".

The name can be written in Hebrew or English — possibly using simple calligraphy. See Hebrew alphabet below. (Alternatively, computer graphics and publishing software can be used.)



The card can be decorated in several ways:

1. Using illustrations below
2. Stapling a small flower (real or silk) in the upper corner



3. Stapling a sprig of fresh parsley (right before the *seder*) to the card
