Presenters

Rabbi Cheryl Peretz, is the Associate Dean of the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies, where she also received her ordination. She also holds her MBA in Marketing Management from Baruch College, and helps bring those skills and expertise into the operational practices of rabbis and congregations throughout North America.



Hazzan Alisa Pomerantz-Boro grew up on Mercer Island, Washington, in a rabbinic home, instilled with a love of Judaism and music. From an early age, she knew she would continue the long family line of rabbis, cantors and educators. Hazzan Pomerantz-Boro was invested as a Hazzan and earned her degree in Sacred Jewish Music from the Cantors Institute of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, where she was awarded the Jacobson Memorial Prize in Hazzanut. She also holds a B.A. in Near Eastern Studies and Music from the University of Washington.



Rabbi Dr. Bradley Shavit Artson holds the Abner and Roslyn Goldstine Dean's Chair of the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies and is Vice President of American Jewish University in Los Angeles. A member of the Philosophy Department of AJU, he is particularly interested in theology, ethics, and the integration of science and religion. He supervises the Miller Introduction to Judaism Program and mentors Camp Ramah in California in Ojai and Ramah of Northern California in the Bay Area. He is also dean of the Zacharias Frankel College in Potsdam, Germany, ordaining Conservative rabbis for Europe. He is the author of 12 books and over 250 articles, most recently Renewing the Process of Creation: A Jewish Integration of Science and Spirit.



Chancellor Dr. Arnold M. Eisen, one of the foremost authorities on American Judaism, is the seventh chancellor of The Jewish Theological Seminary. Before coming to JTS, Chancellor Eisen served on the faculties of Stanford, Tel Aviv, and Columbia universities. An award-winning writer and advocate for the Jewish community, the chancellor's many publications include Rethinking Modern Judaism, and most recently, Conservative Judaism Today and Tomorrow, a collection of essays that explore essential matters of Jewish belief and practice from a Conservative perspective.



Chancellor Dr. Shuly Rubin Schwartz, who became the eighth chancellor of The Jewish Theological Seminary on July 1, 2020, has served JTS both as a groundbreaking scholar and a visionary institutional leader. As dean of two schools and most recently as provost, she has shaped and strengthened JTS's academic programs while teaching and mentoring countless students. She is the first woman selected as chancellor of JTS in its 134-year history.

Rebecca Joy Fletcher has been serving as The ARK's experiential Jewish educator for the past six years. The first person to hold this position, Rebecca administers and runs all group volunteering programs, family volunteering programs, and ARK on the Road, lectures, workshops, and programs. Throughout all these activities, Rebecca's goal remains the same: to educate and emotionally connect Chicago's wider Jewish community to The ARK, and to its clients, their challenges, triumphs, and dreams. Rebecca is also the co-creator and one of the performers of the ARK documentary theater piece "Voices of The ARK" which is regularly presented at parlor meetings and other gatherings. Rebecca came to her ARK position with a wealth of relevant experience – as an ordained cantor and educator (though she does not hold a pulpit anymore), as an arts educator, and as a working Chicago actor and acclaimed Jewish theatermaker. She is proud to work for such a compassionate and forward thinking organization!

She is a celebrated Jewish Rock Radio artist and serves as the host of the Chicago Sings Jewish Rock Radio series, which brings together cantors and musicians from over 20 congregations in the Chicagoland area to create and share original Jewish music. Her song, Stand Strong, has been included in numerous social justice concerts throughout the country including the 2019 Consultation of Conscience in Washington D.C and the American Conference of Cantors 2019 Social Justice concert in Atlanta. The doctors told her parents that she would never be able to walk or talk. She loves being Jewish! She had a bat mitzvah and has chanted Torah and Haftarah numerous times. Rebecca credits her love of learning and singing from her parents. She enjoys tutoring others in the art of Torah chanting and prayer leading. She has led Ma'ariv on multiple occasions including at Tikvah Shabbat at Camp Ramah in New England.



Hazzan Raquel Pomerantz Gershon is an award-winning singer, composer and teacher of Jewish music, devoted to sharing her passion for Jewish music and tefillah to bring people closer to God and Judaism. Raquel & #39's original music includes songs of faith, hope and gratitude that touch the soul and uplift the spirit. Many of them can be found on her two CDs, Jerusalem On My Mind and Candlesticks of Silver. A graduate of the Jewish Theological Seminary as well as Columbia University, Raquel received a Masters Degree in Special Education from Teachers College, Columbia University and is proud to have taught hundreds of students of all ages and abilities at Day Schools, religious schools and Ramah camps. She has presented workshops at the Cantors Assembly convention, Jewish education conferences and at assorted Federation and synagogue programs. Raquel currently serves as the ritual director at Congregation Beth Shalom in Northbrook, and sings with the Jewish Rock Radio Chicago Sings ensemble.



Cantor Leon Sher earned his Master of Sacred Music and Cantorial Investiture from the Debbie Friedman School of Sacred Music at Jewish Institute of Religion of the Hebrew Union College in New York City. 
