The plan for this project was suggested by the National Creative Handcrafts Committee in Summer 1995. With full support from our President Evelyn Seelig, Executive Committee and National Board, guidelines for huppah construction were distributed to the 25 Branches. Each Branch was to create a huppah which it would keep and use after displaying it at our Biennial Convention '96.

We are very proud of the huppot that our Sisterhood women have created. They are beautiful and celebrate our Women's League advocacy of Jewish marriage under a traditional wedding canopy. The wedding ceremony is one of our oldest traditions. More than a religious act, it is a legal act in a religious setting. It has been said that this ceremony goes back to the giving of the Torah, with God as the hatan (groom) and Israel as the kallah (bride), standing under the huppah (canopy shadow) of Mount Sinai.

There are no specific regulations as to the design or construction of huppot. They may be any size. Our requirements were that these had to be 4' wide x 6' long to accommodate our needs for this exhibit. Many Branches have utilized special fabrics and techniques, and/or artistic representations of the flora and fauna of their region.



We salute the special women who put their talent, time and artistry into these beautiful huppot. Thank you to coordinators Gilda Hecht and Ellyn Sheidlower for providing expertise and problem-solving for many of the handcrafters throughout design and construction of the huppot.

Following is a catalog of the 23 huppot created by Sisterhood artists in 23 Branches of Women's League across the United States and Canada.



CENTRAL BRANCH

FABRIC:

white and gold velour

TECHNIQUE: applique, embroidery

HEBREW:

front valence: "I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine"; back: "Be thou consecrated unto me"; one side: "Let there be her in the towns of Judah, the city of Jerusalem..."; other side: "...the voice of joy and gladness, the voice of the bridegroom and the voice of the bride"

THEME:

wedding rings and life cycle - ceremonial wedding ring (18th & 19th century, European style) with notable buildings of the Chicago skyline: Hancock Building, Sears Tower, Stone Container Building and the Water Tower, Judaic symbols: wine decanter, kiddush cup, hallah, spice box and candlesticks on the center part of ring; wheat and corn are agricultural products of the Central Branch states: Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin; life cycle events are depicted in the 4 corners

silk moire, silk, satin, velvet, gold metallic ribbon

TECHNIQUE: applique

"My soul is entwined with thine"

THEME:

blue iris expresses all the joy of a wedding celebration; the rich flower and ribbon motif creates a festive aura which reminds the couple of their special day

lace, silk moire **FABRIC:**

TECHNIQUE: applique, needlepoint

"Spread over us Your shelter of peace" HEBREW:

inspired from an earlier time when weddings took place outdoors so that the marriage should be blessed with many children as stars in the skies; stars in the design converge to form a central *Magen David*; the *Shekhinah* or Divine Presence is manifes the light shining through lace on the bridal couple and the shimmering blues of the sky THEME:


FABRIC: cotton quilting

TECHNIQUE: curved piecing using freezer paper templates, beading, quilting, metallic thread

"I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine" **HEBREW:**

It is customary for the ceremony to be under the stars, reminding us of God's promise to Abraham that his offspring would be as numerous as the stars. In Israel, a *cedar* tree is planted when a boy is born and an acacia tree when a girl is born. Branches of these trees are used to support the *huppah*. The *huppah* symbolizes the home the couple will share. This *huppah* depicts trees, sky, flowers and brings to mind the Garden of Eden. THEME:

silk, cotton, muslin (some recycled fabrics used) **FABRIC:** TECHNIQUE: applique, hand painting and dveing, embroidery

"Many waters cannot quench love", "Praise the Lord, for He is good", "Sing unto the Lord a new song", all on borders; words in central Eden setting: "And behold, it was very good" **HEBREW:**

THEME: Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden - "first love"; lush, tropical flora and fauna of Florida depicted in jewel tones

computer design in style of traditional "Baltimore Album Quilt" with scalloped border and each block being different; Jewish motifs: Shabbat candles, kiddush cup, hallah, m'norah, etc.; Biblical motifs: dove (Noah), rose of Sharon, lyre; blue of scalloped border is reminiscent of Israeli flag

TECHNIQUE:

"Grant perfect joy to these loving companions..." "as You did for the first creatures in the Garden of Eden" (side valances); "...who creates the joy of bride and groom" (front panel)

THEME:

Magen David (colors range from gold to pale cream) on sky blue

THEME: L'dor vador - from generation to generation; state flower of New Jersey, purple violet; wedding rings; Magen David, stars, doves

wings of doves representing refuge, protection, love, care, concern; jewel-toned colors of background are mentioned in Exodus when God specifies what colors the Sanctuary should be: red, blue, purple, twined linen, and gold THEME:

field of sunflowers represents the People Israel; above 7 birds represent the 7 blessings of the wedding ceremony; free style Magen David with Torah in center and representations of 12 Tribes of Israel THEME:

FABRIC: fine quality muslin

TECHNIQUE: fabric paint, applique, embroidery, quilting, beading, metallic thread, sequins

HEBREW: "Splendor and blessing are upon everything" (from Mi Adir, wedding prayer)

THEME:

roof panel: double ringed circle with Hebrew and English; inside circle is *Magen David* enclosing crescent moon and stars, symbols of woman; two doves hold a ribbon with wedding band; valences: Philadelphia historic landmarks: Independence Hall, Carpenters Hall; flowers of Philadelphia and Pennsylvania: azalea, dogwood, mountain laurel and rose of Sharon. When suspended on poles, bell shaped corners with gold tassels suggest the Liberty Bell.

SEABOARD BRANCH

FABRIC: raw silk, felt

TECHNIQUE: applique, embroidery, beading, metallic thread, color dyes, gold couching, quilting

HEBREW:

"May the bridegroom and bride rejoice in each other" (center - Hebrew letters form shape of bride and groom); "Love and friendship, peace and harmony" (words below bride and groom - from 7th wedding blessing); "Blessed are You, O God..." (in arc of sun); "Who makes Zion rejoice with her children" (rear flap - from 5th wedding blessing); "mirth, exultation, pleasure and delight" (front flap - from 7th wedding blessing)

THEME:

foundations of a good marriage: bride and groom stand upon words of 7th wedding blessing; Shabbat candles, kiddush cup, intertwined wedding rings are formed in Hebrew letters; beauty of nature seen in plants, flowers; radiant sun containing opening words of the 7 blessings represents a new Jewish home established in presence of Creator; grapes, corner of front: we are commanded to plant a grapevine at the time of marriage; the grapes also represent continuity to the next generation

FABRIC: cotton blend, cotton knit with petite lacy design, white brocade, blue polyester, sequins, gold lame, silk flowers

TECHNIQUE: applique

"May there be peace in their home; confidence and security in their hearts" **HEBREW:**

cedar and cypress trees planted at birth of male and female respectively; branches are cut from trees at time of marriage and incorporated into their *huppah*; 12 stars represent 12 tribes of Israel; sun represents the joy and brightness the future holds for the couple; 2 doves are symbolic of bride and groom and the Hebrew phrase reflects the hopes for them THEME:

sides: "Like a lily among thorns, so is my darling among the maidens. Like an apple tree among trees of the forest, so is my beloved among the youth;" top and bottom: bride and groom; across center: marriage; all letters in gold paint **HEBREW:**

Biblical flowers depicted as in phrase from Song of Songs 2:2-3 THEME:

FABRIC:

polished cotton

TECHNIQUE: fabric paint, trapunto, beading, sewing and love

"Behold, thou art consecrated unto me by this ring," Top valance: "The voice of the bridegroom and the voice of the bride;" Hebrew lettering design from the alphabet in "The New Work of Our Hands"

2 wedding rings with vows above
